Basics of Board Leadership – *for individuals*

Individuals interested in joining a nonprofit Board of Directors, as well as existing board members interested in strengthening their skills, can learn the key roles and responsibilities of nonprofit board membership in this workshop. Topics include the purpose of nonprofit boards, board/staff relations, use of committees, and best practices for nonprofit boards. Participants interested in volunteering for a local nonprofit board can receive help finding an organization that matches their interests and skills through LeaderLink. LeaderLink matches community volunteers with nonprofit organizations seeking new board members. It is a county-wide collaboration between the Community Foundation for Monterey County and Leadership Monterey Peninsula.
